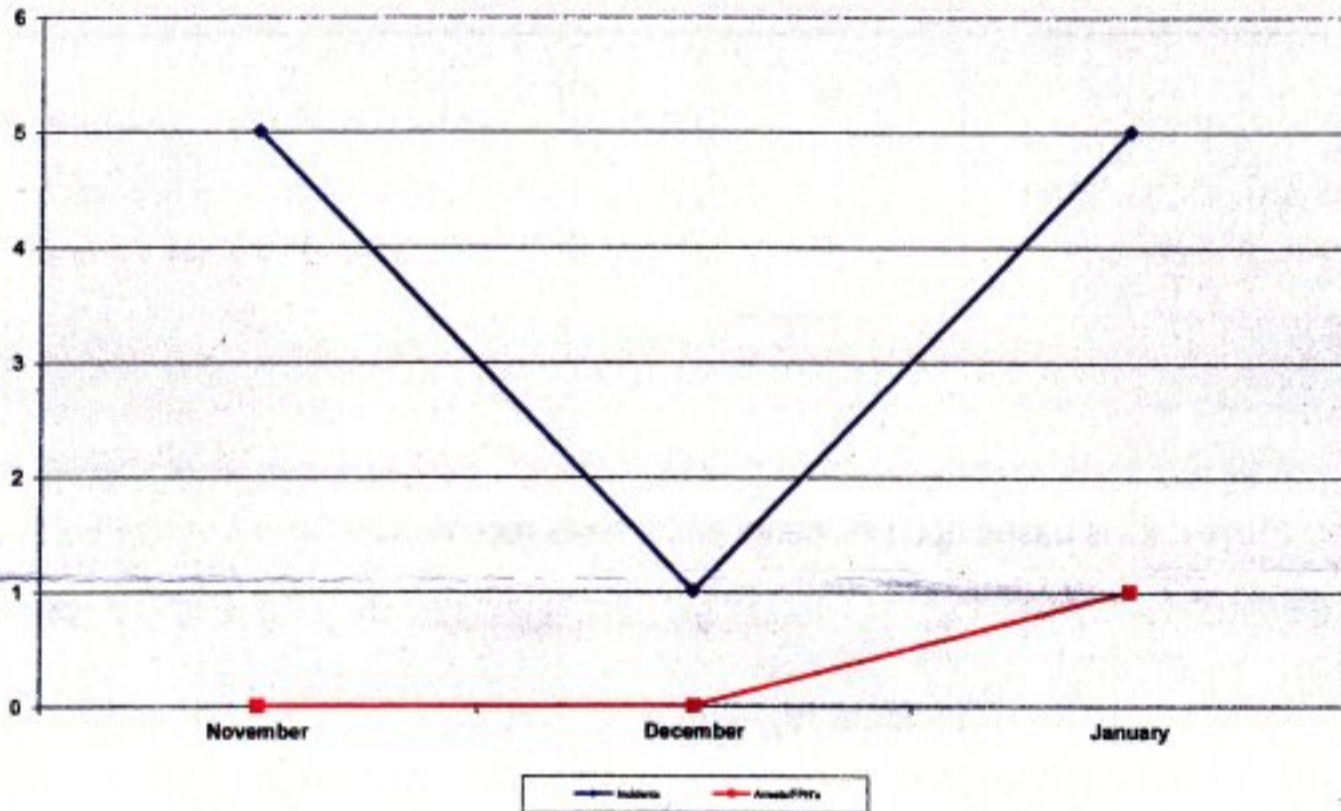
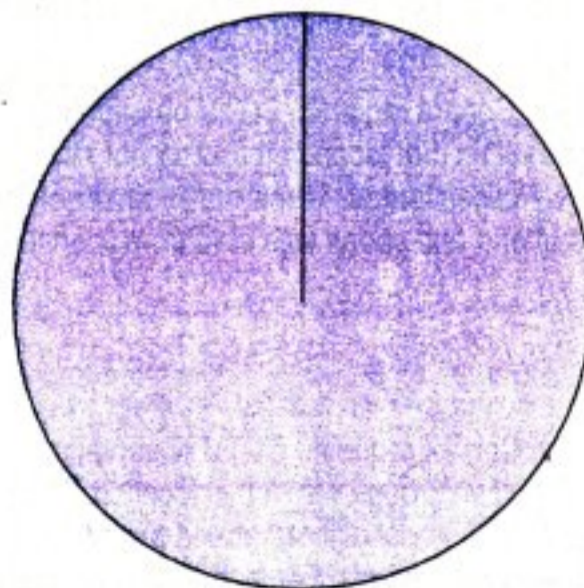

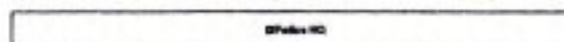
Number of Incidents and Arrests for Whittlesey From November - January

Incident Highlights for January

Incident 1

9th January 2019 at 17:20hrs, Police Control requests CCTV observations for a described female who has been reported missing from home. The CCTV team conducts a full area search for the described female with no trace. The CCTV team continued observations throughout the evening with no trace.

Incident 2

10th January 2019 at 21:15hrs, Police Control requests CCTV observations on licensed premises on the Market Place after a report of three persons within that location throwing bar stools. The CCTV team observes the location and provides live images to Police Control. Three males are seen leaving the premise and heading along Market Street. Local officers attend and speak with staff from licensed premises. No further action was requested.

Incident 3

31st January 2019 at 21:45hrs, Police Control requests CCTV observations on licensed premises on the Market Place after a report of a disturbance by two groups within this location. The CCTV team observes the location and provides live images to Police Control. Local officers attend and all persons spoken with.

As a result of excellent partnership working between Fenland CCTV and Cambridgeshire Police, one male was arrested for assault offences thereby reducing any further alcohol related disorder within our town centres.

Street Pride and Community Groups

At Whittlesey Street Pride's meeting in February the group discussed future litter picks, maintenance to existing projects and ways to promote the group further within the community.

Environmental Health

The Environmental Health Team have been working with local businesses who are applying to be licensed under a new law, the Animal Welfare Regulations 2018. This new law has greatly changed the way that we are required to inspect premises that board cats and dogs, breed dogs, have stables and liveries and Pet Shops.

Across Fenland there are currently 52 premises needing a license. We envisage that there will be a lot more as the new regulations also require anyone making over £1000 for the sale of any dogs and /or cats to be inspected. The inspection of these licensed premises has also changed with a Star Rating system being introduced. Premises gaining a 5 Star Rating (the top rating), will be inspected every 3 years. However a premises gaining only a 1 rating (the lowest) would be revisited annually. However if the premises are not likely to achieve a star rating at all, (which is very unusual) they are encouraged to improve their standards as soon as possible so that a license can be issued by the Council.

Tidy Fenland, Green Dog Walkers

To support the campaign Officers have been out on patrols in our open spaces and particular attention has been paid at:

- The Walk
- The Bower

- Station Road
- Memorial gardens
- St Marys Church yard.
- Manor field

This month has seen some early patrols starting from 7am. These are based on feedback from members of the public. Whilst on patrol we have been checking dog walkers are carrying bags and removing any fouling's seen. We will continue to refresh signage where needed whilst out and about.

To support the Green Dog Walker's campaign we have ordered a dog bag dispenser which we hope to install in the Manor field in March. This, we hope, will help to promote responsible dog ownership and provide bags to avoid people not picking up due to not having one.

Tidy Fenland, Fly tipping

The total number of fly tipping instances recorded for February is 145

This, broken down into areas, is as follows:

- Chatteris – 4
- March – 14
- Whittlesey - 11
- Wisbech – 51
- Villages – 65
- Total – 145

The majority of the fly tipping was household related; with 91 instances. 13 were vehicle related, and 7 commercial waste. As part of our commitment to reduce fly tipping, Officers have been out to 9 fly tips to look for evidence. This includes visits to Morton Leam, Turves, New Road, West Delph and Sycamore Road. Officers continue to monitor Funthams Lane for Fly tipping

Enforcement actions

Patrols have been carried out by both Kingdom and Street Scene Officers in and around Whittlesey.

A total 19 tickets have been issued by Officers this month. 1 of which was in Whittlesey for littering

In February, 22 littering cases were heard at Peterborough Magistrates Court. All were found guilty of littering and fined an average of £400.00.

19 PSPO cases were heard in Peterborough Magistrates Court, these were alongside the littering cases. All were found guilty of breaching a Public Spaces Protection Order and fined an average of £400.00.

Street Scene Issues

- 6 abandoned vehicles were reported in Whittlesey this month.
- Additional litter picks were carried out in the A605 layby and Station Road
- Officers have been monitoring the portaloo at Kings Delph.
- 12 fly Posters have been removed from the town.

Open Spaces

With February following a similar weather pattern to January, Tivoli continued their good work particularly around shrub beds, leaf clearance and moss removal from hard surfaces. Good preparatory work in the winter paves the way for a successful spring and summer season. The mild weather also allowed for an earlier than normal start to the mowing season. The first cut and collect at Whittlesey Cemetery will be in the first week of March.

All beds are now prepared and composted for the introduction of sustainable planting late in March. Orders for plants for many of the beds in the town have now been placed after a meeting with the In Bloom group.
