Firstly I would like to apologise for the delay in you receiving a reply.

I understood that my colleague had spoken with you over the phone and had informed you of the latest news relating to the bridge at King's Dyke.

This is an issue that predated the Combined Authority and whilst we provided money when asked, it is now for the County Council to take the next steps to take the project forward.

It is absolutely regrettable that the time scale has slipped and that the costs put forward by Kia have been unacceptably upscaled. Nevertheless, I know that County held a meeting with the Economy and Environment Committee in which it was unanimously agreed to follow the same route as before and also to reproduce.

Rest assured I am monitoring the developments closely to ensure that from now on this project is managed in an effective way to ensure swift completion of the project.
