This newsletter provides an update on the partnership activity of the Fenland CSP.

Community Safety Partnerships (CSPs) are made up of representatives from the police, local authorities, fire and rescue services, health and probation services. They are known as 'responsible authorities'. Other non-statutory bodies are also invited to be members e.g. residential social landlords.

CSP members work in partnership to tackle crime and anti-social behaviour and to reduce the communities fear of crime and anti-social behaviour.

During the Coronavirus (COVID–19) pandemic, the social distancing measures and restrictions on families and friends gathering to support each other highlights the important role that the partnership and its members have in providing information and support to help keep our community safe.

To meet this challenge the partnership has developed alternative ways to continue delivering key safety messages and workforce development opportunities in Fenland. Residents are participating and engaging with the new online process submitting questions and viewing the completed community safety videos on YouTube. FenlandCouncil - YouTube



Community Safety Engagement Events

Community engagement events are taking place online due to COVID social distancing regulations. These engagement events raise awareness of key safety messages. Residents are invited to submit their questions to FDC via survey monkey and Facebook before the event. These questions are then answered by a panel of experts.

Information linked to reporting and support is also made available to residents through the video description.



Community Engagement - Domestic Abuse & Coercive Control

On the 10/11/2020 the Community Safety Partnership held an online Domestic Abuse & Coercive Control awareness event. It was held in partnership with Refuge and Cambridgeshire & Peterborough Domestic Abuse and Sexual Violence Partnership. Questions were answered on identifying domestic abuse and coercive control and the options available for reporting and accessing further support.

The description that accompanied the published video has been made available via a website link and there is an option for translation to a wide range of different languages.

The finished video was made available on the FenlandCouncil YouTube Channel and shared amongst partners through the Councils Communications Team and Partnerships social media account. The video has registered 150 views in the first 6 weeks of publication.

CSP Workforce Development

Training themes for CSP workforce development are linked to the priorities within the CSP action plan. Frontline staff from statutory and the voluntary sectors are invited to attend these free training sessions.

Those attending include staff from housing providers, FDC teams, police, probation, traveller teams, young people workers, family workers, children centres, food banks, volunteers, schools, healthcare workers, faith groups, community organisations and citizens advice.

Scams & Cybercrime Awareness

On 27/10/2020 the partnership organised a Scams and Cybercrime workforce development session which was delivered using MS Teams. Karen Reid from Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Against Scams Partnership (CAPASP) and Nigel Sutton, Fraud and Cyber Security Advisor from Cambridgeshire Constabulary delivered the session.

It was attended by 22 front line professionals including staff from third sector organisations. The training provided information and advice on current scams and cybercrime methods being used by criminals, advice on how to avoid becoming a victim and information on reporting and support.

Domestic Abuse & Coercive Control Awareness



On 24/11/2020 the CSP partnership organised a Domestic Abuse development session which was delivered using MS Teams. Topics covered were Coercive Control and recommendations from a recent Domestic Homicide Review. Refuge and the Cambridgeshire & Peterborough Domestic Abuse and Sexual Violence Partnership once again worked with the CSP to deliver the session.

It was attended by 24 front line professionals including staff from third sector organisations.

The CSP will coordinate further Domestic Abuse and Coercive Control training opportunities in 2021. This will include the impact of alcohol and substance abuse on domestic abuse and referral pathways and support.

For people concerned about alcohol or drug use but aren't sure what steps to take, Change Grow Live offer a free open-door self-referral service, as well as taking referrals from organisations supporting individuals.

They can offer support to help with challenges including drugs or alcohol, trouble with housing, domestic abuse, or mental and physical wellbeing.

They are an open access service. This means no need for an appointment just attend their centres. Those who take advantage of this service will be greeted by a Peer Mentor who will talk about how the service can provide help and support whilst waiting for an assessment.

The services (Adult) are free, non-judgemental and confidential.

It can be difficult to know how best to help someone close to you who misuses drugs and alcohol. CGL will support family and friends to have a voice and play a positive role in supporting their loved one
