Thank you for your email of 28 April 2021 in relation to the community briefing update regarding Saxon Pit, Whittlesey.

The new bespoke application submitted by Materials Movement Limited is to accept and treat up to 100,000 tonnes of

hazardous soils and aggregates contaminated with asbestos, heavy metals and hydrocarbons.

The applicant's intention is to treat the waste to produce a non-waste material and soils.

The treated wastes will be sold and used for projects elsewhere as there is no intention to use this treated waste for cover material at Saxon Pit.

We have agreed with consultants acting on behalf of the operator that only uncontaminated inert wastes and soils

typically derived from so called green field sites will be used in the remediation and restoration of the eastern buttress at Saxon Pit.

Any other soils derived from sites which aren't from green field sites will be subject to testing, where necessary, to demonstrate their suitability before being used as cover material over the illegally deposited waste.

The application submitted by Materials Movement Limited isn't listed on our website for consultation yet.

We will notify you when this application is to be advertised.
