Well done Deb.



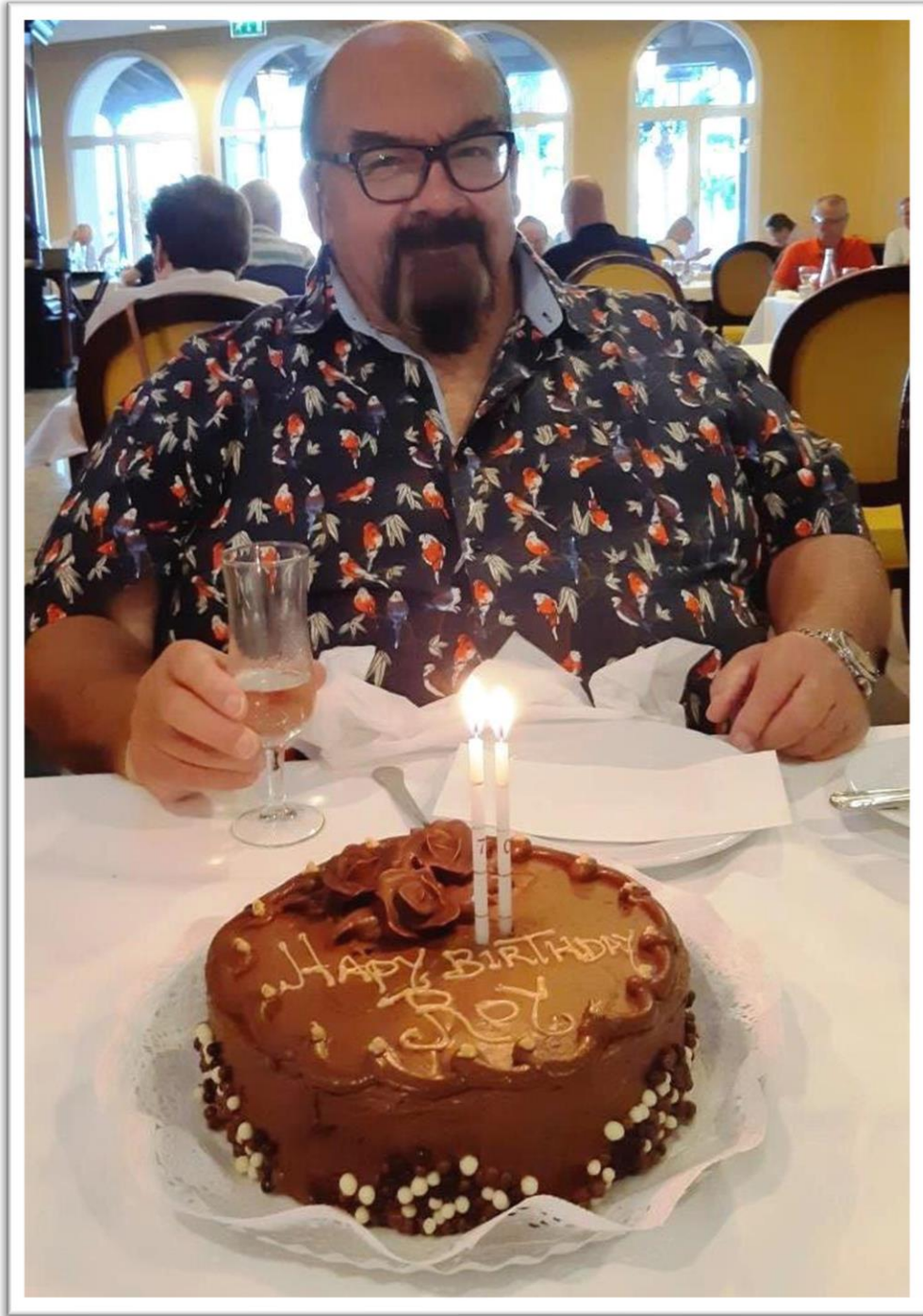
The 12 Year campaign by Councillor Dee Daws to get interactive signs put in strategic areas to inform drivers of issues on our roads.
