Progress on our A47 upgrade

Work continues to deliver the upgraded A47 junction with the A141 at Guyhirn. Once complete, the enlarged roundabout will make the junction safer, improve journey times, and reduce congestion.

What's next

This month we have been completing resurfacing work and repairing the existing road surface. The road will be closed from **8pm on Friday 21 January** to **6am on Sunday 24 January**, with a signed diversion route in place.

We achieved many milestones in 2021 and tried innovative ways of working on the A47 Guyhirn scheme. As the new road layout prepares to open this spring, we look back on some of our achievements:

- The Right Honourable Stephen Barclay MP visited the site (pictured above).
- A speed camera used in the summer resulted in speeding drivers dropping by a fifth (pictured above).
- We hosted several site visits with local youngsters to raise their interest in a career in construction (pictured above).
- We gained a near perfect score of 44 (out of 45, with five additional bonus points available) being awarded by the Considerate Constructors Scheme when measuring standards including health and safety, environmental care, and more, before going one point better with a November reassessment.
- We used virtual reality headsets to help train our team how to work in a safer environment (pictured above).
- We engaged with and employed ex-offenders from HMP Peterborough.

True gritter - new vehicles hit the road





A total of 120 brand new gritting vehicles have been delivered to National Highways to help keep traffic moving this winter.

Cambridgeshire, Bedfordshire, Hertfordshire and parts of Suffolk have received 28 new gritters. The vehicles include state of the art technology so roads can be treated more quickly and up to a maximum of 50mph, 10mph faster than earlier models.
