With a tested brand recognition of 95%, the 40th anniversary logo reflects our widely recognisable traditional logo whilst introducing a softer teal colour. The new central image celebrates and reflects our

Skills training for Neighbourhood Watch volunteers

We are always exploring ways that we can equip our volunteers with the skills needed to best perform in their role. That is why we are excited to offer our volunteers the opportunity to complete the following optional free courses.

COORDINATOR SKILLS TRAINING

This is a free bespoke course provided through our new NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH LEARNING PLATFORM - a training platform tailored to our volunteers.

The COORDINATOR SKILLS TRAINING certified course comprises of the following modules:

- An Introduction to GDPR
- Unconscious Bias
- Equality, Diversity and Inclusivity
- Collaborative Working
- Effective Meetings
- Asking the Right Questions
- Expressing Yourself
- Active Listening



After completing the course and downloading your personalisted certificate, you can explore over 3,000 additional courses on the LEARNING PLATFORM.

BYSTANDER TRAINING

What does being an Active Bystander mean? Why is it important to know what to do when confronted by situations in our workplace, in the street, on public transport or anywhere? Often being that person who either deflects attention away from the victim of harassment or reports what is happening, can make a huge difference to the victim and their community.

What is our responsibility as a bystander? Is it to just ignore what is going on or is it to speak out? How do we do this safely? In this course, provided by L'Oreal and partners, you can explore the main reasons why we don't take action when we witness street harassment.

TACKLING HATE TOGETHER

Hate crime divides communities, creates a culture of fear and makes people's lives a misery. This course enables you to have an understanding of the problem and know some simple steps to tackle it.

The online course is made up of the bite-sized modules:

- Understanding Hate Incidents
- Tackling Hate Incidents
- Reporting Hate Incidents

On successfully passing the modules you can download a personal course completion certificate.

Tackle terrorism with e-learning and apps

With the enduring terrorist threat, it is now more important than ever that everyone plays their part in tackling terrorism.

Action Counters Terrorism (ACT) is encouraging communities across the country to help the police tackle terrorism and save lives by reporting suspicious behaviour and activity.

ACT Awareness E-learning

The ACT Awareness E-learning is a free resource to help you understand the role we can all play to prevent terrorism by protecting and preparing ourselves and others. It contains advice and interactive activities across six modules, including: responding to suspicious items or activity and what to do in the event of an attack.

Neighbourhood Watch launches new Student Council with Co-op



On Wednesday 1st December, 10 students from across the country gathered at Co-op's HQ in Manchester for the inaugural Student Watch Council Meeting.

A team from Neighbourhood Watch, Co-op and student creative agency, Hype Collective, led a full-day workshop with the students, following all Covid safety guidelines. The students had applied to be a part of the Council after seeing the advert in our new student magazine, The Lookout.

The engaging session enabled the students to get to know each other and the team; tell us their feelings around safety, crime and community on and off-campus; and feedback to us their ideas for how a student safety and community initiative (working title 'Student

Watch') could run.





We discussed how the university society system might be involved, student safety ambassadors, crime and safety reporting processes and

resources currently available in student life, and their local communities. Their biggest crime and safety concerns were around harassment and sexual assault, drink and needle spiking, and ensuring inclusion of minority communities in student life.

We all went away with so much learning and positivity for the role students and young people can play in the development of Neighbourhood Watch and vice versa. The students involved were very keen to keep conversations and ideas flowing in between meetings.

Amy Mawby, Head of Fundraising at Neighbourhood Watch said 'We have a huge opportunity to improve safety and community connection on and off-campus in students' lives. We will keep you updated on the progress of this national project, ensuring that the students are the ones driving, developing and owning the work all the way through.'
