Cambridgeshire County Council (Peterborough Road, Whittlesey) (Prohibition of Vehicles and Pedestrians) Order 202- and Cambridgeshire County Council (A605 Peterborough Road, A605 Ralph Butcher Causeway, Kings Dyke, Kings Delph and Station Road, Whittlesey) (40mph Speed Limit) Order 202-

Cambridgeshire County Council proposes to make Orders under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and all other enabling powers.

The effect of the Prohibition of Vehicles and Pedestrians Order will be to prohibit the use by pedestrians and all vehicles on Peterborough Road, Whittlesey from a point 15 metres east of the centre of the Kings Dyke level crossing in an easterly direction for 185 metres. That length of road will be gated with access for authorised users only. The alternative route will be the newly constructed A605 Ralph Butcher Causeway road that effectively bypasses the level crossing.

The effect of the 40mph Speed Limit Order will be to introduce a 40mph Speed Limit on the newly constructed A605 Ralph Butcher Causeway and other adjoining sections of road.
