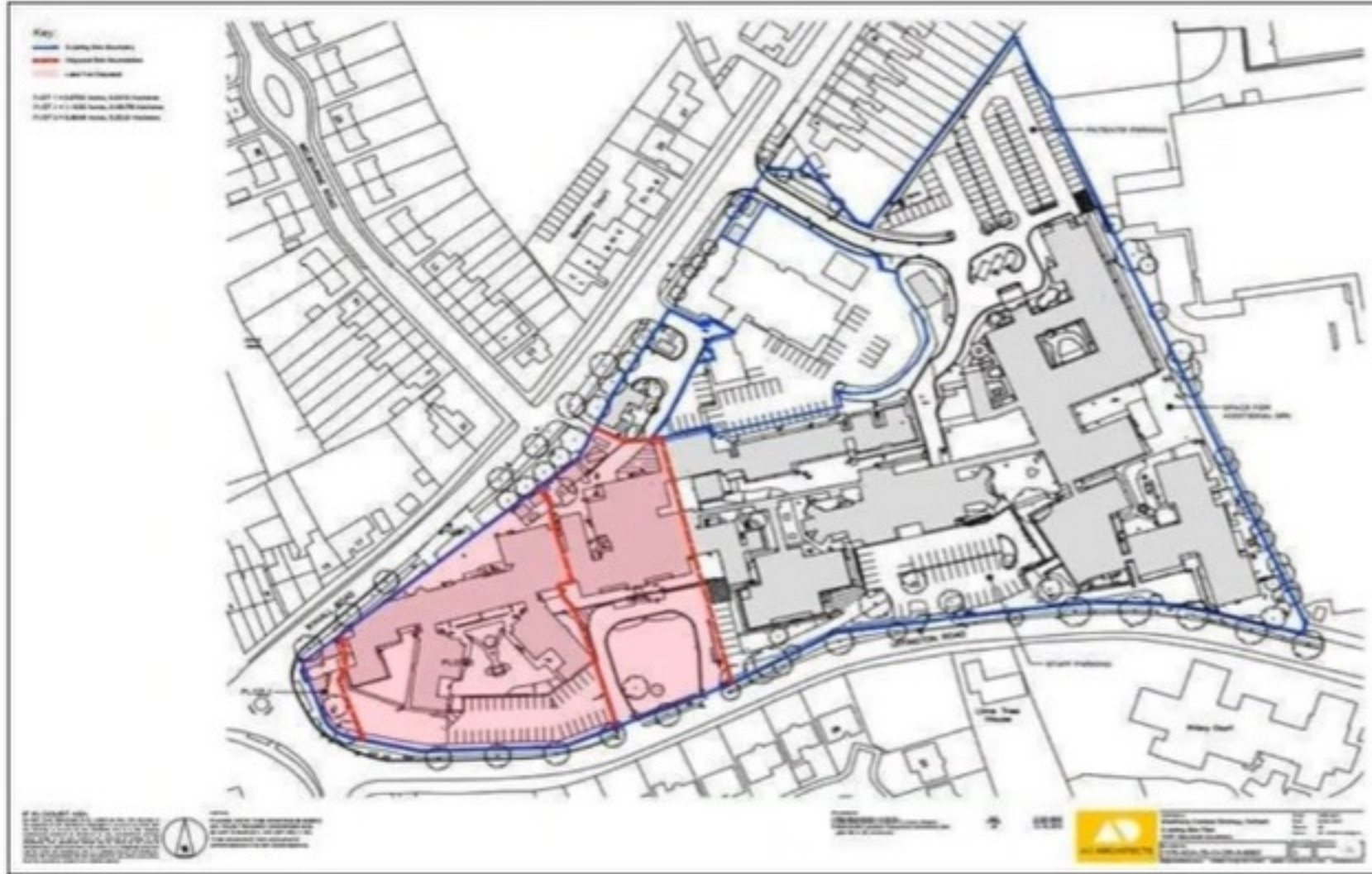

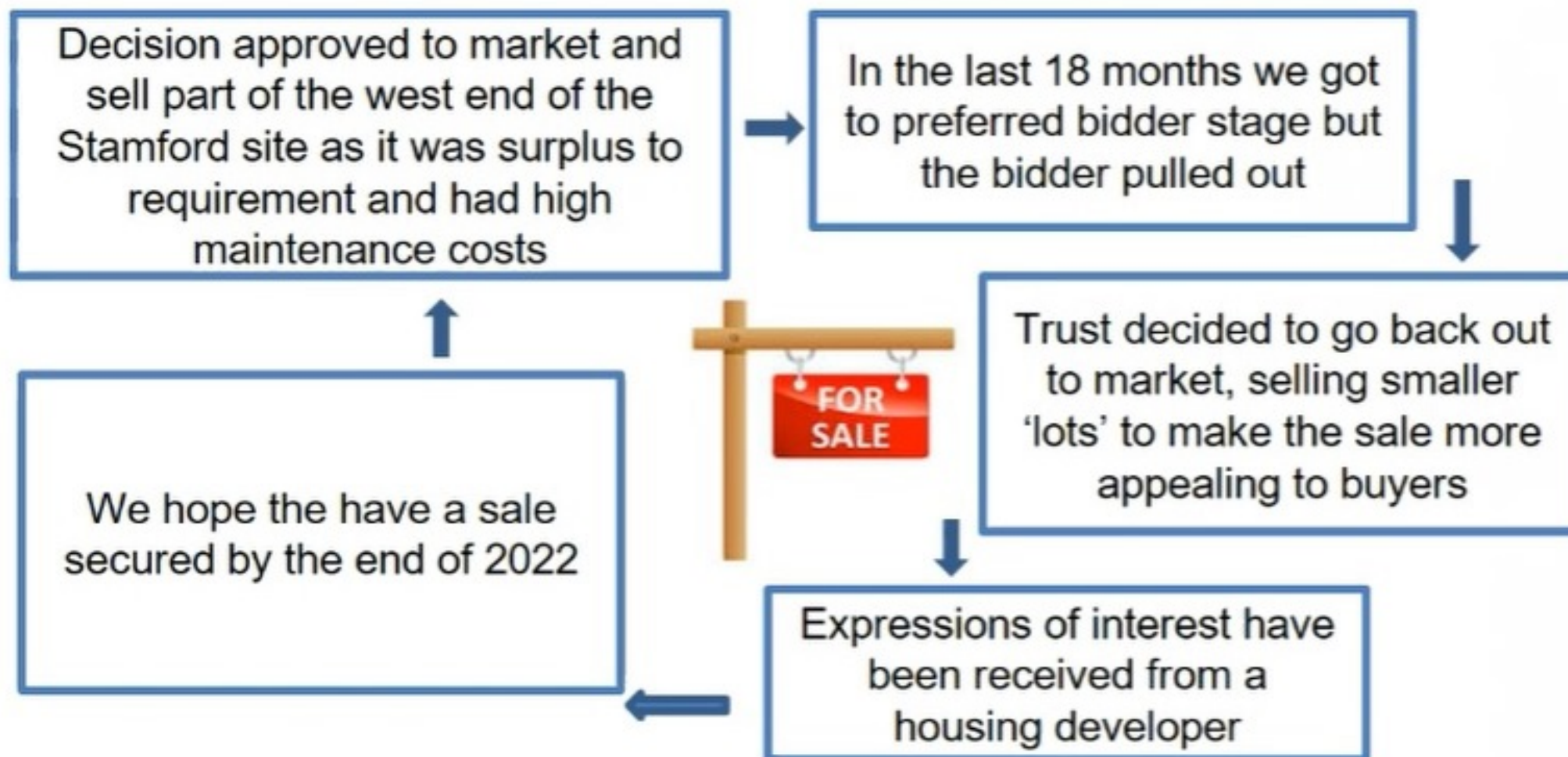

## Where are we now?

Patients in Stamford area are generally in good health but there is a prevalence of age-related conditions and minor injuries



Service development at the Stamford site has been progressive, with the completion of a large expansion project in 2017. Facilities were modernised and improvements in clinical areas were made to accommodate increased patient numbers

Now a need to go further and develop services at the site in line with the vision of the Integrated Care Plan that is part of the NHS Long Term Plan

Strategy aims to develop services at the Stamford Site to meet the needs of South Lincs and Rutland population

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# What are we looking to achieve?

“...to develop services at the Stamford site that meet the specific health needs of the South Lincolnshire and Rutland population, and continue to provide specialist services already established here.”

Our strategy for Stamford is to continue to provide a combination of outpatient clinics and diagnostic services by teams based at PCH and HH, a ‘step down’ ward for patients as part of their inpatient journey, and a minor injuries service.

**In addition there will be a specific focus on providing an elective infusion service, cancer treatments, local anaesthetic surgery and specialist eye care.**

# Current services at Stamford



## Outpatient Clinics

General clinics for local population: Ophthalmology, Urology, ENT, General surgery & Colorectal, Orthopaedics, Pain, Paediatrics, Renal, Respiratory, Cardiology, Rheumatology, Neurology, Maxillo-facial, pre-assessment, COE, Immunology, Gynaecology, Maternity, Endocrine, Diabetes, Gastroenterology, lymphoedema, palliative care, prostate oncology, hand therapy. Chemotherapy infusions. Community services including: physiotherapy, continence, diabetes and Parkinson's.

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# Our Stamford Hospital Vision



## Elective Infusion Service

- We will move part of our existing elective ambulatory care from Peterborough to the Stamford site
- A range of medically supervised treatments will be provided seven days a week, including chemotherapy, haematology, venesection, paediatric infusions
- This will provide care closer to home for patients in Lincolnshire, and some from Peterborough, in a more relaxed environment



# Our Stamford Hospital Vision

## Cancer centre

- We will increase the medical cancer treatments by expanding chemotherapy infusions
- Patients will benefit from the surroundings, away from the acute pressures associated with the busyness of Peterborough City Hospital
- We will build on the existing award-winning one-stop urology clinics for patients with suspected prostate cancer, with other multi-disciplinary clinics such as one-stop skin lesion service, and access to palliative care nurses for patients on end-of-life pathways.
