Street Pride and Community Groups

Whittlesey Street Pride held two litter picks in February. The first pick on 12th saw 24 members attend and collect 36 bags. Then on 26th, 20 members attended and picked up litter to fill 33 bags.

At the groups bi-monthly committee meeting, they discussed future projects and the possibility of holding a summer party as a replacement for their cancelled Christmas party last year.

It is great to hear of volunteers getting back to meeting as a group and taking time to socialise.

Benwick in Bloom have decided to enter this year's Anglia in Bloom competition and are 'going for gold'.

Food safety and health and safety support visits continue with help from additional staff working with the service to ensure the 'recovery plan' for these interventions is on target. We are however still attending as many of the waste sites in the area as possible. We attended at 10 fly tips in Whittlesey. The waste found was mainly household related. Consisting of a mixture of black bags and bulky items. Sadly, despite searching amongst the waste there were no leads to follow up, but we had the waste removed quickly to deter further accumulations. New anti-fly tipping signs have been placed in key areas. Our prevention work has also taken place in the villages.

The 2 outstanding Fixed Penalty Notices issued for Duty of Care offences (where a householder has failed to check who they gave their waste to, ultimately leading to it being fly tipped) have now been paid. We are also referring a case to legal for prosecution following our investigations relating to waste dumped at Snowley Park.

Tidy Fenland - Green Dog Walkers

Last month saw a small increase of dog fouling seen around our town and villages. As a result, we kept a visible presence through patrols and ensured signs were refreshed/put up and delivered information to nearby residents regarding this issue in the hope whoever is responsible stops or are reported to us. A copy of the card posted through letter boxes is below:





The main areas visited are, Horsegate, Kingfisher Drive, Church Street, Arnolds Lane, Coronation Ave, Whitmore Street, Broad Street, Park Lane, Manor LC, Victory Rd, Hallcroft Rd, Riverside Close and open space Thornham Way Eastrea.

We continue to monitor the cemetery following reports people are ignoring the PSPO in place which bans dogs.

Abandoned and Nuisance vehicles

Street Scene received 15 reports of vehicles being abandoned this month, with 3 being in the Whittlesey area. Upon investigation 1 owner was contacted via a DVLA search and moved their car, another car was moved by the owner while we were on site and the last car was in a private car park and belonged to a resident. We also had 1 further report of nuisance vehicle parked on Snoots Rd what was removed by CCC Highways.

Markets & Fairs

Sadly, the weather has hindered the amount of public visiting our markets this month.

The recent storms saw people stay away. The Council did recommend to traders that they should not trade on the Market during storm Dudley due to excessive strong winds.

Yet despite this set back the nearly full capacity Friday Market is still going strong and with regular traders reporting a loyal customer base.

Street Scene Actions this month

- Trade waste 1 black bag was discovered by at litter bin in High Cause Ways and the shop responsible spoken to regarding their waste collection. A follow up visit will be made in March.
- CCC Highways 5 issues reported in relation to fallen trees, unsafe road signs, a loose bollard, and a loose kerb.
- Marked 2 graves and monitored Whittlesey cemetery.



- Clarion have been notified of 2 large holes in their grass verge on Crescent Rd following a visit.
- Cleansing have continued their good work. 3 requests from Street Scene have been made regarding a full litter bin, broken glass, and the damage to the disabled toilets floor, as the door is not locking consistently.
- BT were advised that 2 of their green boxes were broken and 1 had fallen blocking the footpath.
- Additional Littering patrols have taken place in Lovells Court, Queen Street, Victory Rd and Funthams Lane.
- Parks and Open Spaces we reported 2 fallen trees while on patrol and an overgrown hedge containing litter.
- Refuse 1 visit following a complaint regarding missed bin and resident spoken to.
- Street Pride we continue to assist our volunteers with their good work and follow up any areas that they feel needs patrols or intervention.

The successful contractor (same as Snowley Park) was duly appointed to undertake the extension to the play area at Burdett Grove and work will commence in April 2022 on a 3–4-week programme worth £45k.

Several willow trees were cut back along the Manor field side of the Bower, the work was necessary and in the light of the subsequent storms this proved to be very opportune. We did lose a tree in St Mary's Church Garden, one on the Bower and one in Mulberry Close


but damage in the town compared to elsewhere was minimal and no damage was reported.



Incidents by Call Source for Whittlesey for January








