
WTC Meeting – Thursday 21st April 2022

Public Forum:- 4 members of the public present – no one wished to make an address/comment.

Agenda Items for Discussion:-

Clir Mason:- Councillor Surgery – Since being reintroduced, not that many residents taking up these once a month engagements. There are some concerns over security at such events. After some debate, it was decided to keep the once per month surgery ongoing until further notice, Residents need to make an appointment via the Town Clerk in advance and will be limited to 15 minutes per person.

Clir Gerstner:- Flagpole – For Council/Peel House This was/is not my project however I have taken

ownership of it from another Councillor – informed the rest of Councillors attending that a costing of approximately £250:00 which includes fixing and installation as opposed to another quote in excess of £2200;00 By a majority vote it was decided to go with the lower quote.

Clir Mrs Mayor:- The Town Clerk had investigated Jubilee Bunting and 250 hand-flags at £350:00 and this was voted as acceptable.



Clir Mason:- Travelling Fair @ Whittlesey have requested an extension of Sundays to run the popular Fairs, this would enhance the Fair Operators to have an extra day for the events. The conscientious was in favour providing that the Fairground Operators vacate the Car Park by 9am on the Monday.

Cllr Gerstner:- A605 and Barr Street. The A605 (not including Kings Dyke works and Railway Crossing) in in a very poor state of repair, County Councillor Connor is in agreement, the road is in need of being surveyed as to what is required to be fit for purpose. Cllr Boden highlighted drains and gully issues. Barr Street being a 'Rat Run' is a small piece of road that is also in a bad state of repair. Requested that WTC contact Cambs Highways for input. I have also been informed that there is not planned budget or major works planned for the A605 in the current financial year, even though Cambs CC had an underspend of £7 million on last year's Highways budget.

Other Business: Financial reports considered and budgets looked at.
