#### Housekeeping

Whilst many of you are quieter at this time of year, I would suggest that now could be a good time to check paperwork is up to date. Please let me know if you need any assistance for example, you are missing paperwork, such as the health and safety sheet, signing in sheet, risk assessment template or require refresher risk assessment training.

Over the coming months I will be attending many of your meetings and would like to ask that a copy of your risk assessment is available for me to look at / copy to take away.

You should ideally be checking your groups risk assessment annually to make sure that it is still fit for purpose and refreshing it when there is a change to the activity, location or people taking part.

An insurer may ask to see the group's risk assessment in order to demonstrate that you considered any significant hazards, which might have been foreseeable, and took reasonable action to manage the risks posed before and during the event.

It is also important the signing in sheets are filled out so you have a record of volunteers present at the start and end of the event who have ticked to confirm that they have read the health and safety sheet before beginning the event and agree to abide by said rules.
