I've tried to keep to facts and have been tripped up on the very rare occasion with 'hearsay'.

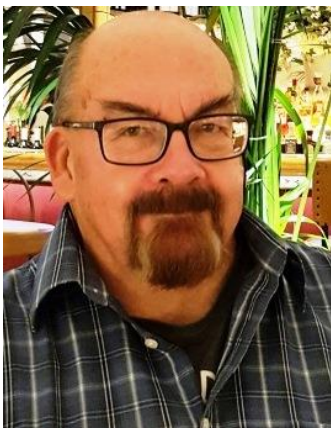
I look back at some of my early posting, and the some of the battles 13+ years ago we are still fighting. But I have to say – I've been pretty consistent.

So my thanks to you – all of you and the **3,000,000** visits you have made, I hope that in general 99% of the posts I make a factual and relevant.



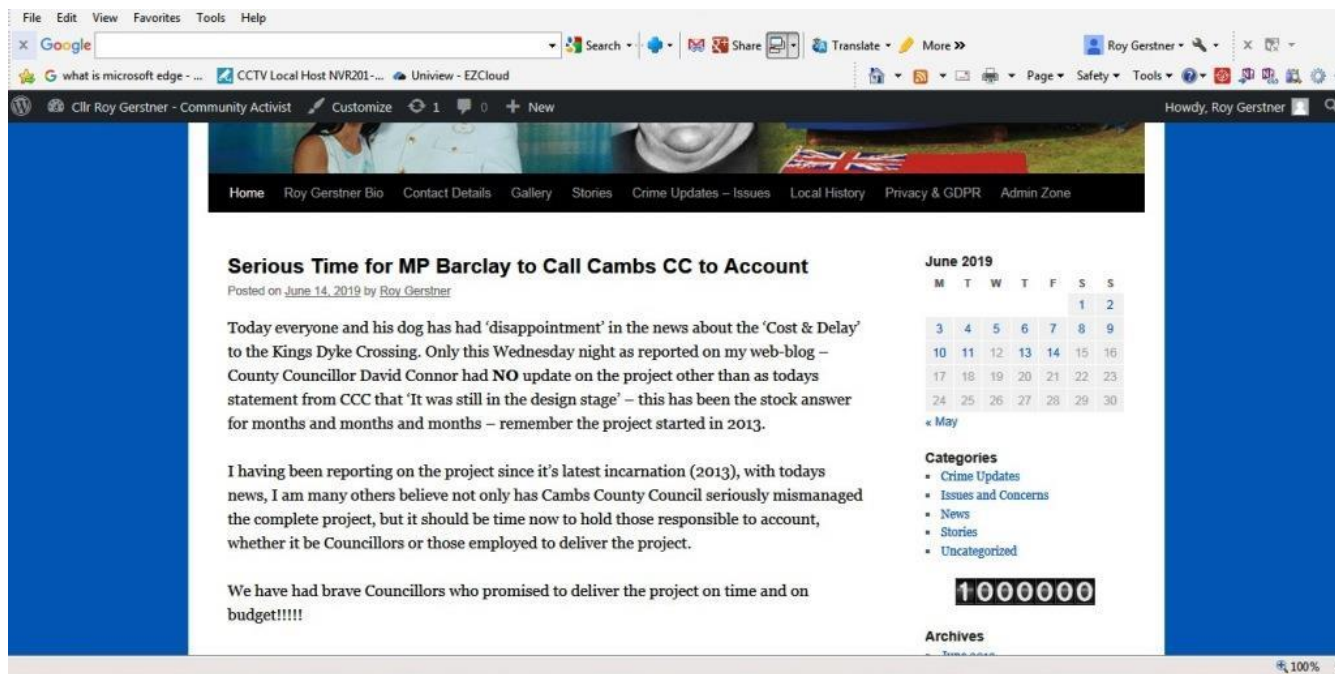
