Tidy Fenland – Green Dog Walkers

9 dog fouling incidents were reported during this time and were promptly removed. We also had a report of a dog being exercised in a play area and as a result have been carrying out patrols. This spring we have seen quite low numbers of dog related incidents and hope this is because of the visible presence we have had through our engagement patrols as well as ensuring signs are refreshed or placed in key areas. We have also been out and about delivering information to nearby residents regarding responsible dog ownership and remain working with the green dog walker volunteers.

While patrolling local key areas, we came across 2 of the reported fly tips. At one site we found evidence which is now being followed up. Both waste piles were reported for removal.

Abandoned and Nuisance vehicles.

This month in Whittlesey we have had 4 reported vehicles. All have been investigated and were later removed by persons unknown.

Street Scene Actions.

- We have reported 1 issue to CCC Highways in Newlands Road, regarding an overgrown verge blocking a footpath.
- Cleansing was asked to remove broken toys from Newland Road following a visit and a bin was reinstalled, as it was found missing.
- Refuse - 3 properties were visited regarding wheelie bins left on the highway.
- Richardson Way - bulk bins were reported as overflowing and upon an inspection it was discovered this was due to a Clarion resident moving out leaving all their waste. While on site photos of the waste, including the paint they left on the communal access carpet has been sent to Clarion.
