#### **Ride and Stride**

**Roger Brown** took part again in this event this week year and sent us this report Cambridgeshire Historic Churches Trust – Ride and Stride: Saturday 14th September 2024.



The Ride &Stride event is always held on the second Saturday of September the objective of which is to raise money by visiting as many churches or chapels as possible by whatever means of transport. I have always cycled and this year decided I would visit some churches in the Yaxley Deanery, St Ives Deanery and the churches of our own benefice in the March Deanery, as detailed in the September Newsletter.



It was cooler than last year (33C) and I decided that I needed my bright orange jacket which I was grateful to have. I set off along the Green Wheel only to realise that I didn't have a key to lock the bike so went back home to get this and started off again at 11.05. I cycled to Stanground Lock, and onto St John's church Stanground where I arrived at 11.30. There was sadness with the pioneer priest Rev'd Carol Avery having died the previous Tuesday after a short illness. [Funeral service at Peterborough Cathedral at 1pm on Tuesday 8th October.] There was also joy with a couple having returned to the church where they were married 55 years ago, not having been back to the church since.

Living in Chesterfield and having holidayed on the east coast they felt called to drive to St John's on the way home. I continued on my ride reaching Stanground Baptist church at 11.55 and St Margaret's Fletton at midday. I had now completed 5 miles. I spoke to the two people at St Margaret's who were intending to set up a heritage display for the afternoon but unable to find the right key to open the porch gate of the church. I could not assist them and I made my way to St Mary's Farcet where a church fete was taking place.



Wonderful refreshments. The church was raising money for a compostable toilet and had a portaloo on site for the weekend as extra way of advertising the need for a toilet. I



thought I would try out the spacious loo which included baby changing facilities. All very efficient! Back on the bike I arrived at St Peter's Yaxley at 1 pm. A Beautiful decorated cross was at the front of the church. I thought the church was locked but found a door open with a flower arranger busy using her talents making a floral creation. After a chat with her and her husband and signing the visitor book I enjoyed the downhill section of road reaching 20 mph as I headed for St Giles at Holme. The sun had appeared making it warmer and the fields of sunflowers basked in that sunshine along the road I was travelling. It was

1.23 pm when I arrived at the church, part of the Fen Edge Churches benefice and the original home of the Victorian Floating church, The Fenland Ark. I browsed through the literature and chatted to the Rector, Becky. The Coffee Ark was outside the church, a mobile coffee shop (a professionally converted and restored Land Rover Defender 127).



It was sheltered and the warm so I took my jacket off. The Coffee Ark was there from 10 am to 4.30 pm and I had a coffee chatting with the locals for whom it was a meeting point. It was billed as a 'Gift Day' helping to raise money for the church.

I had now completed 13 miles and replacing my jacket I headed across Holme Fen to Ramsey St Mary's. The Lancaster flew above me on its way to the Duxford Airshow and

some other ancient aircraft were obviously on that same flight path. It was more than a gentle breeze that was behind me which meant it was easy to travel at 18 mph. It was 2.15 pm when I arrived at Ramsey St Mary having now covered almost 20 miles. The church was open but unattended. Journeying on it was almost 3 pm when I reached St Thomas a Becket, Ramsey's parish church. Again, the church was open but unattended. I spent a short time in the church before setting off once more, this time towards St Thomas, Pondersbridge. As I headed out of Ramsey travelling at 16 mph, a cycle came whizzing past me. I noticed the huge tyres and the sound that was being generated by this mode of transport and knew it to be an electric dual-purpose bike. Under human power only I reached St Thomas at 3.40 pm. I felt I was now on home soil as I set off along Glassmoor Bank towards Eastrea and onwards to Holy Trinity church at Coates. It was now 4.25 pm and I had travelled 35 miles. As I cycled into Whittlesey I found the bottom of the Eastrea dip one of the worst pieces of road to cycle on. Coming out of the dip towards Aldi the ruts on the side of the road were difficult to miss particularly with the busy passing traffic. Commercial vehicle drivers are very good at leaving the requisite passing space under the updated Highway Code (rules 162 to 169) but a few private vehicle drivers don't seem to know about it.

Arriving in Whittlesey I went to the Methodist/URC church and St Jude's Roman Catholic church, St Mary's and finally St Andrew's at 5 pm. I had completed almost 40 miles by the time I returned home. Just over 40 miles taking into account the false start.

Praise the Lord that I could achieve such a ride approaching my 80th birthday. Thank you, to all, who have given sponsorship money for this event. Total sponsorship money will appear in the next Newsletter.

#### Important Information about the Church Electoral Roll(s)

Please note that the Electoral Roll will be completely renewed this coming year (2025) as it is every six years. If you do not live in the parish of the roll you wish to join, and are not prevented from attending worship e.g. through ill health, then you will need to attend worship in the parish at least once a month for the six months preceding the next APCM - usually held sometime March-May. Please let us know if you'd like to check which parish you live in (or you can check online by tapping your postcode into www.achurchnearyou.com

#### What is the Electoral Roll?

It is your parish church's register of electors. In the same way that being on the civic Electoral Roll allows you to vote in parliamentary and local elections and referenda, joining the Church Electoral Roll means that you can vote on Church matters, attend the Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) and stand for election to the PCC.

### Being on the Electoral Roll does NOT make you a "member" of the Church; simply regarding your parish church as your spiritual home does that.

#### Who can join the Electoral Roll?

To apply for the Electoral Roll you must meet ALL of the following conditions:

- You must be aged 16 or over.
- You must be baptised.

- You must be a member of the Church of England and **EITHER** live in the parish **OR** have attended worship in the parish regularly (at least once a month) for the past six months (or more) unless prevented from doing so, e.g. through illness.

The renewal of the Electoral Roll will take place just prior to the APCMs next Spring.

Our annual service to remember all those we have loved and lost this side of eternity will be held on All Souls day -**Saturday 2<sup>nd</sup> November** at 2pm.

All are most welcome to join us for this quiet and reflective service which will include some hymns, readings and the opportunity to light a candle in memory of a loved one.
