

Raising awareness of child exploitation in your area with #LookCloser



Not all young people will tell you when they are in trouble. And sometimes they won't know they are in danger, because they have been groomed to believe otherwise.

Exploitation often happens when individuals or groups develop friendships with young people, before taking advantage of their innocence to force them into criminal activity. From sexual abuse to forced labour, money laundering, and drug trafficking, young people across the UK are being exploited. It can happen on public transport, in shopping centres, car washes, public parks, or online, through social media and gaming platforms.

It is everyone's responsibility to safeguard our young people. For this reason, The Children's Society launched the #LookCloser campaign, which aims to help people spot and report the signs of child exploitation.

The signs

Although children react to trauma in very different ways, typical signs of exploitation include:

- Unaccompanied children visiting a house where only adults live
- Young people who appear anxious, frightened, angry, showing signs of neglect or displaying other behaviours/injuries that concern you
- Increased callers at a property
- Increased antisocial behaviour at a property
- Not seeing the resident for long periods of time
- Unfamiliar vehicles at the property

If you spot any of these signs, you have a duty to act. What should you do about it?

By raising awareness of the signs of exploitation, we can keep children and young people safe. If something doesn't feel right, it might not be. **As a Neighbourhood Watch supporter, you and your neighbours are in a position to spot the signs and report them to the police on 101, or 999 in an emergency**. If you are unsure, you can call the NSPCC for advice on 0808 800 5000. The #LookCloser campaign also has a range of resources that you can download. NHS 111 stickers available in the NW Shop!

This winter, the NHS is encouraging people to get to the help they need by using NHS 111, and we want to remind you of the window stickers that are available to order from our shop now. This is part of our partnership with the NHS to encourage people to use 111 online or call 111 when they think they need medical help fast.

We are recommending that the sticker be affixed so that both sides of the sticker remain visible. Through this message being placed within homes, it will prompt residents to use NHS 111, either for themselves or a member of their community. NHS 111 helps assess and direct people to the most appropriate service for their medical needs.

The NHS 111 service is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week. You can call, go online or use the NHS App to get:

- the right healthcare in your area; or
- a call back from a nurse, doctor or paramedic; or advice on self-care.

People should call 111 to speak to someone if they need to:

- discuss complex medical problems;
- discuss worries about a long-term condition; or get medical advice for a child under five.
