## Upcoming county council election - Thursday 1 May 2025

The election is the chance to make a difference in Cambridgeshire so it is important that you participate if you are eligible to vote. We look after a budget of around £1,164 million to run vital services that make a real difference to people's lives, such as:

- roads and footpaths
- libraries
- household waste disposal
- schools
- adult and children's social care

The Mayoral election for the Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Combined Authority (CPCA) takes place on the same day.
